

2020-21 Night School is a Choice Program at Agassiz - Students

1. FPS Night School classes are held at the Agassiz building. Other Agassiz evening programs include GED, English Language Learner, Even Start and community sports.
2. FPS Night School classes are held in a concurrent, multi-course format using Plato as a backbone to meet district and state standards. This flexible arrangement is beneficial.
3. FPS Night School has 16 super-block class meetings plus a make-up night (#17)
 - a. 6:00 – 9:00 pm with a 7 minute break.
4. Reporting. Power School is used for Nightly Attendance and Unit Grades and Final Grades
 - a. Plato progress and can be accessed by students, counselors, and administration.
 - b. Progress reports will be sent to your school and parents/guardian after the 4th, 8th, and 12th class.

Student Expectations (Beyond attendance and punctuality)

- A. Come ready to work with a respectful and responsible attitude. Night School is a choice program!
- B. Closed campus. Once a student has arrived, he/she is expected to remain in the night school assigned area for the rest of the class meeting. If a student leaves the night school area without permission, they are not permitted to return to class for the rest of the given night class' meeting.
- C. During break, remain on 2nd or 3rd floor "T" East end of Agassiz.
 - a. Vending machines are located on 2nd floor.
 - b. Please be a respectful student guest on the Agassiz campus.
- D. Seat time. Students must attend at least 13/16(17) class meetings.
 - a. 9 hours of total absence are allowed.
 - b. Students are withdraw-failed if they exceed 9 hours of total absence.
 - c. Night school seat time requirements apply even if a student finishes the course early.
 - d. Snow days. Night school is cancelled if day school is cancelled. Work from home.
 - i. The night will be considered a virtual night for teachers and students.
- E. Tardies and early exits are rounded up to the nearest half hour. (i.e. A 12 minute tardy = 30 minutes.)
- F. Coursework, pacing and homework. Weekly, students can expect to complete approximately 3 hours of coursework outside of class-time.
- G. Other expectations found in your day school's student handbook are in effect.
