Increasing Learning Opportunities for FPS Students

As the Superintendent of Fargo Public Schools, I am thrilled to announce an array of enriching academic program opportunities available for the 2024-25 school year. These programs are meticulously designed to cater to a diverse range of learning styles and academic needs, ensuring every student in our district has access to an education that resonates with and empowers them.

Dakota High School: Located at Agassiz, this program is ideal for grades 10-12 students who are highly independent and self-directed. It employs a HyFlex Learning model, perfect for learners balancing multiple priorities or those with limited campus access.

Self-Directed Academy: This program for grades 6-8, based at Agassiz, combines in-person and online learning. It's tailored for independent learners who benefit from technology-integrated, self-paced education. Registration for the Self-Directed Academy will begin after Spring Break.

Virtual Academy: Available for grades K-8 and 9-12, this fully online program is best suited for students comfortable in digital learning environments and who have reliable technology access.

Explorer Academy: Located at the Explorer Academy, this K-8 program focuses on students needing specific educational accommodations as per their Individualized Educational Plan.

Day Treatment School: Also, at the Explorer Academy for grades K-8, this program integrates academic instruction with therapeutic support for students with significant mental, behavioral, or emotional health difficulties.

Empower(Ed) Program(s): Available at North HS, South HS, and Davies HS for grades 9-12, this traditional/blended learning program is ideal for students who thrive in structured, in-person environments.

Trollwood Mentorship Program: A unique collaboration between Trollwood Performing Arts School and Virtual Academy, this program for grades 9-12 blends academic instruction with arts mentorship.

Bridges Program: Operating out of Youthworks for grades 6-12, this program combines academic instruction with wraparound services, serving as an alternative to school expulsion.
