It Will Soon Be Time to Develop the 2025-2026 School Calendar

The Calendar Committee will begin meeting in January to develop the 2025-2026 school calendar. The Calendar Committee will be comprised of elementary school, middle school, and high school teachers and principals; central office administrators; a school board member; parents; and students (one student from each high school). Their charge will be to develop a draft 2025-2026 school calendar.

To assist the Calendar Committee with its work, every other year a survey is issued to parents, staff, and students to gather their perceptions about questions/issues that impact the development of the school calendar. This survey was given last year (2024-2025 and 2025-2026 Calendar Survey), and the results were used to develop the 2024-2025 school calendar and will be used to develop the 2025-2026 school calendar.

The survey link was published in articles in SchoolTalk and The Journey, on Facebook, on Twitter, and was emailed directly to high school students. More than 2,500 individuals (students, parents, and staff) completed the survey. The results of the survey are below.

Once the committee has come to consensus on a draft 2025-2026 school calendar, the committee will be asked to go back to their peer groups to gather input for possible modifications to the working draft. This input will then be utilized in the subsequent working drafts of the calendar until the committee comes to consensus around a 2025-2026 school calendar. Finally, the draft calendar will be shared with the School Board for review, input, and final approval later in the spring.
