Policy Type: Executive Limitations

Standards Based Academic Program

The Superintendent shall not fail to ensure that the district implements a standardsbased program of instruction that includes clearly defined academic content standards for specific courses of study to achieve the Board's Results for student performance.

Accordingly, the Superintendent may not:

- Fail to develop and implement academic content standards that meet or exceed nationally-recognized model content standards
- 2. Fail to develop a curriculum aligned with and designed to enable all students to meet or exceed the established standards
- 3. Fail to ensure that the academic program includes all legally required courses and programs
- 4. Fail to ensure that the academic program actively addresses the needs of all students and avoids gender, ethnic and cultural bias
- 5. Fail to ensure that the academic program includes opportunities for individual students to develop specific talents and interests in more specialized areas
- 6. Fail to ensure that the academic program addresses the different learning styles and needs of students of various backgrounds and abilities
- 7. Fail to appropriately utilize staff and other appropriate elements of the community in developing the standards and the academic program
- 8. Fail to encourage appropriate innovative or experimental programs, carefully monitoring and evaluating the effectiveness of all such programs, and informing the Board annually about their effectiveness
- 9. Fail to ensure that all academic programs, including content and practice, are regularly evaluated and modified as necessary to assure their continuing effectiveness
- 10. Fail to notify the Board of any additions, significant changes or permanent eliminations of any departmental level academic program or academic course

- 11. Fail to consider class size and organization as important components of the academic program
- 12. Fail to develop assessments that will adequately measure each student's progress toward achieving the content standards
- 13. Fail to ensure that all staff members are qualified and trained to perform the responsibilities assigned to them
- 14. Fail to adopt a policy to allow students enrolled in grades six through twelve to earn course credit through educational opportunities with a sponsoring entity. The policy must provide criteria consistent with any statutory requirements.
