## **KINDERGARTENERS CONCLUDE “BUG WEEK” WITH LIVE INSECT PRESENTATION**

As the conclusion to the Eagles Elementary Kindergarten Bug Week, Don Carey, aka “The Bug Man,” from the NDSU Entomology Department outreach program, will bring several large and unusual live insects to do a show and tell presentation on May 24 for the 60 kindergarteners. The entomology outreach programs present information about insects in an educational and entertaining manner and are used to supplement elementary science and foods curriculum. Carey often brings insects such as tarantulas, giant cockroaches, scorpions, and tiny flour beetles.

To celebrate Bug Week, the students have been studying a different insect for each day of this week, and teachers have incorporated facts and visuals related to the bug of the day into their literacy, math, and art studies for the kindergarten students. Students have listened to fiction and non-fiction stories related to insects, created bug-themed craft projects, and have even made and eaten insect-themed snacks, such as “ants on a log” (celery stalk filled with peanut butter and topped with a line of raisins).

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
